

The Heritage Butter Factory building has ten display rooms packed with photographs, equipment and memorabilia which trace the family, social, civic, commercial and maritime history of Busselton.

Everything from agriculture to whaling; from crockery, clocks and cameras to sewing machines, travel and transport is included.

Special Features:

- 1850 bedroom and nursery
- 1850-1950 kitchen furniture and utensils
- 1850-1960 civic dignitaries and records
- 1860-1900 formal dress, dining and entertainment
- 1918-1952 butter making
- 1920s model sawmill
- 1940 general store
- Displays that demonstrate the development of mechanised laundry and the safe, cool storage of food.

The one-hectare site is nestled on the banks of the picturesque Vasse River. A replica of the former Jetty Rotunda enhances the vista and the exhibits demonstrate Busselton's diverse agricultural, forestry and maritime history.

Special attention is focused on the famous 1920's Group Settlement Scheme which shaped much of the development of the South West.

- A replica of a Group Settlement "humpy"
- A fully restored and furnished Group Settlement house, dairy and milking shed
- A fully restored and furnished 1920 one-teacher school
- Horse drawn vehicles and machinery
- Tillage and fodder equipment
- Timber industry engines and machines
- General farming machines and memorabilia.
